

**CDP NONPROFIT
BOOT CAMP
OFFERINGS INCLUDE:**

FUNDRAISING BOOT CAMP (\$199.00/seat)

Participants build key fundraising tools for the organization. Participants learn about the **engagement to investment continuum** & how to create and deliver a compelling hook to engage potential donors & supporters.

GRANT WRITING BOOT CAMP (\$199.00/seat)

Hands-on learning, including a crash course in **grant prospecting, intense analysis of your project** by experienced grant drill sergeants, **qualified leads** vetted by CDP staff & **completion of a real proposal.**

GOVERNING BOARD BOOT CAMP (\$199.00/seat)

Outline the roles & responsibilities of an effective **BOD** regarding **strategic planning, fundraising, resource & image development.** Participants assess their strength & explore the practical application of honoring the board duties of care, compliance, loyalty & account management.

STRATEGIC PLANNING BOOT CAMP (\$300/org) (3 – 5 representatives of executive staff, board, volunteers & beneficiaries)

Hands-on learning, including a critical look at the organization's **vision, mission & core values.** Identify the organization's **strengths, weaknesses, opportunities & threats.** Participants outline a 3-5 year strategy for moving forward & consider resources to pay for growth and development.
